

With the help from Christian Aid they are hopeful to combat extreme weather by planting resilient crops, conserving water and making fertilisers.

Friendship is the sweetest form of love. So when I say I'll be your friend until the end, it's as good as saying, I'll keep you in my heart until its very last beat,


Note to self: Don't measure your progress using someone else's ruler.
